A Brief Introduction of the College

Govt. Jinnah Islamia Graduate College Sialkot owes its existence to sublime ideals and philanthropic approach on the part of Anjuman-i-Islamia, Sialkot in response to the divine injunction regarding imparting education. This prestigious institution is situated amidst the hub of medical activities, flanked by thickly populated area outreaching cantonment and suburban areas of Sialkot. - To promote the ideas of Quaid-i-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah and Madar-i-Millat Mohterma Fatima Jinnah.








The Registrar Office


The registrar office is an integral part of the college administrative mechanism. Responsibilities of registrar office are as under:

- Preparation of BS program schedule of midterm exams, sessional activities and preparation of result thereof.








- Timely submission of sent up of the students to the University.

- Organizing and conduct of meetings called by the Principal.










The Estate Office



It also assists the students with a wide array of aspects related to pursuits of post study engagements. It also focuses on administrative task, disciplinary matters and those geared to hands-on assistance.


Duties and Responsibilities


Bachelor Studies in Information Technology







Intermediate Programme (HSSC)

Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) is Pakistan's popular qualification for 16 to 18 years old. The Higher Secondary School Certificate, also known as HSSC, is a public examination conducted by Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education in Punjab (Pakistan). After passing SSC, the Higher Secondary School Certificate is granted in Science, General Science and non-Science programs. The students studying in Science programs are awarded Faculty of Science (F.Sc.)



in which the students choose their Pre-Engineering, Pre-medical. Whereas, in General Science, Computer Science related programmes are offered. For students who want to pursue their career in Social Sciences and Humanities, HSSC provides Faculty in Arts (FA) which is a holistic approach of all the contemporary social sciences subjects. Curriculum: HSSC curriculum offers a variety of routes for learners with a wide range of abilities, along with the ways that can help them to refine their abilities and skills. The syllabus is set by Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Gujranwala (BISE). The curriculum usually includes a combination of seven courses including elective and compulsory subjects.

HSSC is two year duration education and examination is held by BISE Gujranwala annually for each year. The certificate is awarded on the basis of Part-I and Part-II examinations comprising 1100 marks in total. The students failing in Part-I examination cannot repeat it; but have to reappear along with their Part-II examination.

Admission Schedule: Intermediate

Admission to Govt. Jinnah Islamia College, Sialkot is conducted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations, framed by the Higher Education Department and BISE Gujranwala. Admission forms, both online and manual, to the candidates are made available just after the declaration of result of matriculation. The Registrar Office announces last date for the submission of the applications/ forms.

Intermediate Programme (HSSC): Admission Requirements

Admission to Govt. Jinnah Islamia College, Sialkot for male students only is by applications or online process. Forms may be obtained from the College Office during working hours. The College follows the policy of Govt. of the Punjab and reserves the right to apply its own admission criteria approved by college council, following the line of direction of public sector institutions and can be amended without prior notice. Whereas the decision by the College Council shall stand final and students are admitted on the basis of academic record, personal qualities and promise of contribution to society. All students are required to sign an undertaking to fulfill College requirements both in conduct and in study. There are no casual or part time students. Applicants should carefully select their subject combination, as no change is allowed after the stipulated period of one month.

Entrance Requirements: Only those candidates who have passed their Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examination in the Fresh 1st Annual/previous 2nd Annual with at least 60% marks in Faculty of Science, Computing & Information Technology and 50% marks in other faculties will be eligible to apply for admission. The students of 'O' Level may also apply for admission with original equivalence certificate issued by Govt. of Pakistan Inter Board Committee Chairman (IBCC), Islamabad. The students who have passed their Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examination from other than Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, Gujranwala shall have to enclose original No Objection Certificate (NOC) at the time of submission of admission forms.

Admission Forms: Application for admission may be submitted online to Govt. Jinnah Islamia College, Sialkot website and hard copy must be submitted by hand to the admission office within the prescribed time notified by the admission office. No Admission Form shall be accepted after the expiry of the last date for submission of Admission Forms except with the special permission of the Principal or Admission Committee.

Form Submission: The candidate has to submit admission form complete in all respects to the admission office along with following documents.

- Three (3) attested photocopies of School Leaving Character Certificate

- Original NOC of concerned Board if Matriculation is other than BISE Gujranwala
- File Cover

Display of Merit List: After the passage of deadline of submission of admission forms, the registrar office shall issue merit lists of each faculty. Faculty shall offer limited seats in each discipline. In case, seats remain vacant after the closing date of first merit list then second and third merit lists will be displayed both online and notice board. The college believes in meritocracy, hence merit shall be followed in letter and spirit.

Deposit of Fee: When the name of the candidate appears in merit list then he will have to come with his parents/guardian to finalize admission process. He'll bring original documents with an affidavit, on judicial paper worth Rs.100/- duly signed by him and parents/guardian, to this effect that the candidate has not taken admission in any institution/college. After the verification of original documents, he will submit his fee on prescribed Challan Form in the prescribed Bank. In case of failure to deposit his fee within due date, will forfeit his right to admission. After the completion of all formalities pertaining to admission, admission is offered.

Intermediate Programme (HSSC): Admission Policy

- Admission process starts on the date announced by the Registrar Office of the College and continues according
 to the schedule of BISE Gujranwala. Students should contact to the College General Administration Office for
 further information.
- The college encourages using online admission facility, candidates shall apply online and hard copies of their application forms along with required attested documents and submit to the college admission office.
- To avoid inconvenience, the details of required documents are available in the prospectus as well as online on college website.
- Applications which are not registered within due date, whether online or manually, shall not be considered for admission.
- 5. The principal may keep 10 % of the total number of seats in each faculty for 15 days for meritorious students who may not turn up for admission within the prescribed time for admission due to unavoidable circumstances. The minimum marks declaring a candidate as meritorious will be determined by the admission committee of the college.
- 6. If a student applies for admission one or more years late (maximum up to two years), he/she shall produce an affidavit to the effect that he has not been admitted to any college / institution previously and he is availing the opportunity for admission for the first time.
- Students passing in supplementary examination are not eligible for admission in the academic year in which he has passed the examination.
- 8. Students who failed in any class or did not appear in the examination or discontinued their studies are not allowed re-admission in the same or lower class.
- 9. Students failed in one or more subjects are not allowed to take admission in Part-I of Intermediate.
- 10. Students placed in "E" grade in SSC exam are not allowed admission in 1 "Year in any faculty / group.
- 11. General conditions as well as conditions specific to particular faculty/group or subject for admission to the Intermediate Level are those set by the BISE Gujranwala for the relevant level, faculty or subject.
- 12. No regular admission in any class is allowed to a candidate who has already passed equivalent examination in another faculty/group or subject.
- 13. The candidates who fail to confirm their seat by depositing the required fee within stipulated time period shown on merit list shall lose their right of admission and his seat will be offered to the next candidate in order of merit. However, if such candidate(s) turn for admission at a later stage and vacant seats are available then such candidates may be given opportunity before offering admission to next candidate(s) having lower stage on the merit list.
- 14. Cancellation of Admission: Admission in the college shall stand cancelled under the following circumstances:
 - If any information given by the student in his Admission Form is found to be incorrect at any stage.
 - If a student fails to attend the classes within 10 days of the start of the session.
 - If a student is found to be professional agitator, or has been struck off from any educational institution on disciplinary grounds.
 - If a student is practically involved in politics or political organization.
 - On the request of the student provided the request is made within a specified time period notified by the registrar office.
- 15. Struck off on Account of Absenteeism: A student who remains absent for more than six (6) consecutive days without approved leave shall be struck off the college rolls without any notice

- 16. Re-Admission: A student whose admission is cancelled or whose name is struck off on the basis of long absence can apply for re-admission to the Principal within 10 days of the issue of such notification. The Principal may allow his re-admission on payment of the Re-admission fee/Admission Fee and any other outstanding dues. Re-admission for the second time in a current academic session shall not be generally allowed. However, genuine and deserving cases may be submitted to the Director of Education, (Colleges) Gujranwala Division on the basis of valid documentary proof with the condition that the applicant can make up for his shortages and can fulfill the requirement of 75% attendance during the remaining period of the session.
- 17. Change of Subject: Change of faculty is not allowed. However, change of subject is allowed subject to the following conditions:
 - The student must apply for change of subject within 30 days of the start of the classes.
 - Change of subject is allowed only within a faculty or group of subjects, subject to availability of seats.
- 18. Migration: Migration to or from the college may be allowed by the Principals of both the colleges subject to the conditions.
 - That the applicant is seeking migration from a college situated beyond 16 kilometer of this college
 - That the request is based on genuine grounds like parents/spouse transfer, family shifting, family enmity or marriage duly supported by documentary proof.
 - Marks obtained by the candidates in the last examination passed are not less than the minimum marks obtained by a regular student of that class.
- The migration is within the prescribed time period of BISE Gujranwala

All students are required to sign an undertaking to fulfill College requirements both in conduct and in study. There are no casual or part time students. Applicants should carefully select their discipline. In case applying for other disciplines, separate application for each discipline will be submitted.

Entrance Requirements: Only those candidates who have passed their Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) Examination with at least 45% marks are eligible to apply for admission, with no more 21 years of age. The students of 'A' Level may also apply for admission with original equivalence certificate issued by Govt. of Pakistan Inter Board Committee Chairman (IBCC), Islamabad. The students who have passed their Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) Examination from other than Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education not falling in the jurisdiction of Govt. of the Punjab shall have to produce original *No Objection Certificate* (NOC) at the time of submission of admission forms.

Admission Forms: Admission forms, both online and manual to the candidates are made available as per schedule of University of the Punjab and hard copy must be submitted by hand to the concerned department. The Registrar Office announces last date for the submission of the applications/forms. No application form or request is entertained after the passage of due date.

- The college encourages using online admission facility, candidates shall apply online and hard copies of their application forms along with required attested documents submit to the college admission office.
- To avoid inconvenience, the details of required documents are available in the prospectus as well as online on college website.
- 4. Applications which are not registered within due date, whether online or manually, shall not be considered for admission.
- 5. If a student applies for admission one or more years late then deductions of 2%marks for each year shall be observed as per policy of University of the Punjab. Besides, he/she shall produce an affidavit at the time of finalizing the admission to the effect that he has not been admitted to any college / institution presently and he is availing the opportunity for admission for this institute only.
- 6. Students who obtained less than "45% marks" (Third Division) in HSSC examination are not even allowed to submit admission form as per policy of Higher Education Commission (HEC).
- 7. General conditions as well as conditions specific to particular faculty/discipline for admission to the Undergraduate Level are those set by the University of the Punjab for the relevant level, faculty or discipline i.e.in case applying for Bachelor of Science in Botany or Zoology, the candidates who have passed Pre-Medical examination are allowed to submit forms. For Bachelor of Science in Mathematics or Physics, the candidates who have passed Pre-Engineering examination are allowed to submit forms. In other disciplines, the candidates are preferred who have studied relevant subject in their HSSC.
- 8. No regular admission in any class is allowed to a candidate who has already passed equivalent examination in another faculty/group or subject.
- 9. The candidates who fail to confirm their seat by depositing the required fee within stipulated time period shown on merit list shall lose their right of admission and his seat will be offered to the next candidate in order of merit.
- 10. Cancellation of Admission: Admission in the college shall stand cancelled under the following circumstances:
 - If any information given by the student in his Admission Form is found to be incorrect at any stage.
 - If a student fails to attend the classes within 10 days of the start of the session.
 - If a student is found to be professional agitator, or has been struck off from any educational institution on disciplinary grounds.
 - If the CGPA of a student remains less 1.5 in two consecutive semesters as per policy of University of the Punjab.
 - If a student is practically involved in politics or political organization.
 - On the request of the student provided the request is made within a specified time period notified by the registrar office.
- 11. Struck off on Account of Absenteeism: A student who remains absent for more than six (6) consecutive days without approved leave shall be struck off the college rolls without any notice
- 12. Re-Admission: A student whose admission is cancelled or whose name is struck off on the basis of long absence can apply for re-admission to the Principal within 10 days of the issue of such notification. The Principal may allow his re-admission on payment of the Re-admission fee/Admission Fee and any other outstanding dues. Re-admission for the second time in an entire academic career shall not be generally allowed. However, genuine and deserving cases may be submitted to the Director of Education, (Colleges) Gujranwala Division on the basis of valid documentary proof with the condition that the applicant can make up for his shortages and can fulfill the requirement of 75% attendance during the remaining period of the session.

General Discipline Rules

It is mandatory to follow the following rules of discipline in letter and spirit for enrolled students at Govt. Jinnah Islamia Graduate College, Sialkot. If some student is found in violating these rules, punitive action shall be taken against him/her.

Students are directed to maintain highest standard of behavior and discipline both inside and outside the College.

Students are required to improve and maintain consistency in their performance in the College examinations in order to get Roll No. slip for final exam of Board/University.

6. They shall strictly observe the disciplinary rules framed by the College. Violation of which will be dealt by the Principal in the manner he considers fit and his decision will be final.

7. On the first bell, students shall assemble in the rooms and wait silently for the teacher. When the teacher enters the classroom the students shall rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit.

8. No student shall enter the class or leave the class without the permission of the teacher.

9. The college administrator keeps a close watch on the students' attendance, progress and conduct.

10. Irregular attendance, indifference in regard to class work and examination, discourtesy towards teachers, insubordination, obscenity in word and act, willful damage to College property, anti social activities etc. are liable for disciplinary action which includes expulsion from the College.

11. Attendance to the College functions like College assembly, seminars, group discussions, etc. are obligatory to all students.

12. Without the permission of the Principal students shall not organize any activities or associate with any outside union or group concerned.

13. No meeting shall be convened, no outside person shall be invited, no publication shall be issued and no canvassing and mobilizing of the students for any particular purpose shall be made without the prior permission of the Principal.

14. The Principal shall have the power to expel any student from the College if the student is guilty of serious misconduct or student's presence in the College is injurious to the order and discipline.

15. Late comers can enter the class only if permitted by the teacher. They may be marked present by him/her at the end of class only if there is sufficient reason for being late.

16. Use of smart phone and smoking are strictly banned inside the campus for all students. If found, a fine of PKR. 1000/- will be charged with a warning letter.

17. Every student should possess his/her identity card issued by the College which should be displayed. If it is lost, new card will be issued with a fine PKR. 500/-. The card shall have to produce whenever asked for specially when dealing with the office.

19. There is nothing that can substitute for self discipline and a serious devotion to duty, a spirit of respect and love for all that is good, noble and beautiful in life. The College expects students to keep their vision high and solicit cooperation of the parents to minimize the necessity of enforcing rules and regulations.

21. Loitering and wasting time on the College campus and canteen causes indiscipline on the College campus and that must be avoided rather they must ensure their free time in library.

22. Student's any type of vehicle isn't permitted in the college campus rather specific place is organized for this purpose adjacent to College.


Library Rules

- 1. The library remains open from 9.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. on all working days.
- Students are admitted in the Library and Reading Room on production of Identity Cards.
- 3. Books taken out by staff / students shall not be retained for more than a fortnight (14) days from the date of issue.
- 4. Failure to return a book on the due date makes the staff/student liable to a fine of Rs.50/- per day.
- 5. Borrowers are responsible for the loss or damage to books taken out on loan or for consultation by them. The marking of books in ink or with pencil, spoiling or injury to binding, underling of passages, writing of remarks, etc on the leaves of the books or on illustrations, tearing off pages, pictures, etc. will be held to be serious charges.
- 6. Sub-Lending of books is not allowed.
- 7. Students must clear their dues before they receive their Roll No. slips for the University Examinations at the termination of their academic course or before they receive their Transfer Certificate, if they leave before the completion of their academic course.
- 8. All books taken by the Teaching, Non-Teaching and Students are to be returned in time for Annual Stock Verification. All books are to be returned if a member of staff takes leave for more than a month / Transfer to another College.
- In all matters regarding the library the decision of the principal shall be final.
 Complaints and suggestions related to services from the Library shall be given in writing to the Principal.











